Quarterly Report – January/February/March 2012

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Executive Summary

The new year started with a bang as the Northwest Region staff attended the Society for Historical Archaeology conference in Baltimore. FPAN had, as usual, a strong showing with staff organizing and chairing symposia, presenting papers, and participating in panel discussions. FPAN also hosted an information table in the Bookroom, handing out literature on FPAN programs, host institutions, and lots of swag! The Society for American Archaeology conference is coming up and FPAN staff also will present papers and host a table there.

The early part of the year generally is consumed with preparing for and then delivering Florida Archaeology Month programs. This year, NW Region staff got a jump-start by presenting a Boy Scout Merit Badge clinic at the annual Gulf Coast Council Jamboree. Over 40 Scouts completed the clinic and earned their Archaeology Merit Badges! Archaeology Month kicked off with an event in Panama City (Bay County), including a lecture Friday evening and Archaeology Day Saturday, bringing over one hundred people to the Bay County Library to learn about archaeology in Florida. NW Region staff also participated in heritage days at Arcadia Mill Archaeological Site in Milton (Santa Rosa County) and at Eglin Air Force Base (Okaloosa County). The FPAN Coordinating Center hosted our 5th Annual Archaeology Month Celebration event, with heritage organizations from around the region, kids' activities, historic crafts demonstrations, the Destination Archaeology Resource Center, and our lab open for volunteers. Nearly 200 people came out to learn about archaeology, and some participated in our first Dash Through the Past scavenger hunt through historic downtown Pensacola. We capped the month with another event in Port St Joe (Gulf County) featuring a lecture at St Joe Peninsula State Park and Archaeology Day at the Constitution Convention State Museum. Although bad weather prevented large crowds from attending, some folks braved the storm to hear about a Confederate battery on the Apalachicola River, in keeping with the Civil War theme this year. A weekly lecture series, "Beyond Our Backyard: Archaeology Around the World," featured presentations on sites in Jamaica, Ireland, Israel, Italy, and the cosmos! Averaging 30-35 people each week, it proved a popular addition to our Archaeology Month offerings.
