The Florida Public Archaeology Network – Southeast (FPAN-SE) celebrated our third anniversary as of June 1st. With this in mind, we have seen an amazing quarter of growth and expansion: we introduced over 4500 people to FPAN and its goals through 12 lectures, 11 meetings, 15 separate training sessions including a Heritage Awareness Dive Seminar (HADS) and Commission Assistance and Mentoring Program (CAMP) trainings, 12 days of events, and 34 youth education opportunities. We also have had contact with the county archaeologists in all of our counties and set up a meeting with the Executive Director of the Historic Florida Keys Foundation for July. Our efforts with local governments have been increased and inroads continue to be made. Finally, we participated in the May HADS seminar and we have already incorporated some of the information from that seminar into our programming.

We are very proud of the turnout at "Passport to the Past" Day at Gumbo Limbo Nature Center. We estimate that at least 500 people visited the park that day with many staying for multiple portions of our programming. We were able to include partnering organizations such as Gumbo Limbo Nature Center, FAU Anthropology Department, Palm Beach County Planning Division, Loxahatchee Battle Field Preservation Foundation, Palm Beach County Historical Society, Bonnet House and Museum, and FPAN West Central in the event. "Passport to the Past" day ended up being a great networking opportunity amongst the participants as well as with the public. The FAU graduate assistants have assisted the staffing of many of these events, and we hired Crystal Geiger to help support our summer programming.

Public lectures and presentations continued to be popular in our Southeast region with over 250 people attending lectures in this quarter. Two professional presentations at SAA and FAS were completed in the past quarter, in addition to seven public lectures. Of particular note were the three lectures provided by professional archaeologists at the "Passport to the Past" day.

Importantly, both Michele Williams and Sarah Nohe attended CAMP training at Delray Beach, and Michele attended Certified Local Government (CLG) training at Ft. Lauderdale. These two workshops allowed us to meet many of the local Historic Board members and introduce ourselves to communities interested in becoming CLGs.
