Education Highlight: Archaeology Merit Badge at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse Outstanding Natural Area

In December, FPAN SE staff partnered with the Bureau of Land Management at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse Outstanding Natural Area to host an Archaeology Merit Badge for the Scouts of America. Scouts camped out underneath the lighthouse and over the course of the three-day program had the opportunity to make replica artifacts, learn about the techniques archaeologists use when they investigate a site, and analyze commonalities between resource allocation across various cultures globally.
