

## Second Quarter Highlight: Preserving Historic Cemeteries: CRPT at the Frierson Hendry Cemetery

Natalie De La Torre Salas led a CRPT workship at the historic Frierson Hendry Cemetery in Fort Myers. This cemetery was established in the 1870s and is thought to be the oldest cemetery in Fort Myers. Over the course of the morning, participants learned about laws protecting historic cemeteries, methodology, and issues surrounding cemetery management before heading out to an afternoon practical session to clean headstones with D-2.



### Third Quarter Highlight: Calusa Coast and Florida Archaeology Month event series

Throughout 2024, Natalie De La Torre Salas collaborated with multiple organizations in the area including Lovers Key State Park, the Randell Research Center on Pine Island, the Marco Island Historical Society, and many others to put together a series of events in March highlighting the archaeological record of the area. The Calusa Coast event series included talks, festivals, and presentations. The program is a collaborative effort between museums and educational organizations in Southwest Florida to educate people about the archaeology and ethnography of the Indigenous peoples of Southwest Florida. This year the program had over eight events, ranging from archaeology festivals to Community Conversation about Heritage At Risk.

### Other Highlights

- De La Torre Salas participated in COP28 in Dubai as part of the Latino Climate Heritage Council.
- De La Torre Salas completed Archaeological Resource Management training.
- Ayers-Rigsby provided assistance to the State Division of Historical Resources with a potential 872 case. This case received signficant media attention including <u>WINK</u>, New-Press, and WBBH.
- Ayers-Rigsby's ongoing efforts at Ortona Mounds (Glades County) were documented as part of an WGCU mini podcast, <u>Forgotten Park</u>.
